

AWI CONFLICT MINERAL STATEMENT

AWI conducts a good faith reasonable country of origin inquiry (“RCOI”) regarding Conflict Minerals at least annually. Our process is designed to assist with the development and maintenance of a responsible supply chain for minerals from conflict areas, as outlined in the OECD Guidance, and facilitate reporting compliance with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act.

As defined in the Act, “Conflict Minerals” are columbite-tantalite (coltan), cassiterite, gold, and wolframite, including their derivatives, which are limited to tantalum, tin, and tungsten. The “Covered Countries” are the Democratic Republic of the Congo (the “DRC”) and countries that share an internationally recognized border with the DRC (the Republic of the Congo, the Central African Republic, South Sudan, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania, Zambia, and Angola).

AWI’s intent is to not knowingly purchase materials from the Democratic Republic of Congo or adjoining countries; or to purchase Conflict Minerals directly from mines, smelters, or refiners.

We engage with our suppliers to obtain complete, correct and trustworthy information about the supply chain. We have incorporated language in our written contracts and purchase order terms and conditions communicating that our suppliers should comply with all applicable laws.

AWI is committed to ensuring that the metals and other minerals contained in our products are obtained, produced, and used in a socially responsible manner.
